# **Enhancing Deadwood's Utility Box Wraps**

Deadwood's downtown and historic neighborhoods now have historic photos adorning many of the utility boxes. These utility boxes have provided the community with electricity and now also provide a canvas of adornment and admiration. Deadwood's first utility box wrap was installed by Quik Signs of Spearfish, SD in May of 2018 at the Days of '76 Rodeo Grounds.

The image selection was coordinated through the Neighborhood Block Clubs and the City Archives of the Deadwood Historic Preservation Office. The City Archives has over 10,000 historic and contemporary photos in its holdings. Members from different block clubs (Burnham, Library, Pecks Garden, Presidential, Rodeo Grounds, Stage Run and Upper Main Street) meet with City staff, who then make recommendations based on the utility box location. Once historic images are selected, the digital file is forwarded onto Quik Signs to begin the quote and wrap design.

Service techs conduct an onsite survey of the proposed utility box, measuring and photographing, to develop an accurate quote. Back at the shop, measurements are combined with historic photos to create a digital proof. Upon final approval, Quik Signs' begin printing the wrap. The ink used for the wrap has to "off-gas" for at least 24-hours before laminate layer is applied. Laminated vinyl graphics provide a layer of protection from UV rays and the outdoor elements.

On average, the installation time for a utility box is 2-4 hours depending on size and intricacies of the box. Temperature and weather conditions provide the greatest obstacle for proper installation of the utility wrap. The minimum installation temperature is 45 degrees, but it's preferable to have warmer temperatures ranging between 55-75 degrees. Windy or rainy conditions provide installation delays, so date flexibility is paramount for best results. Once installed, the wraps' average life span is 5-7 years.

The next time you're sitting at an intersection or crosswalk, take a moment to locate and review the numerous and valuable utility box wraps in Deadwood.




# A NEW CHAPTER AT CARNEGIE LIBRARY AS LEADERSHIP TRANSITIONS

Patricia Brown's last chapter as Library Director is coming to a close — filled with years of adventure, laughter, and plenty of overdue kindness. Now, a fresh




