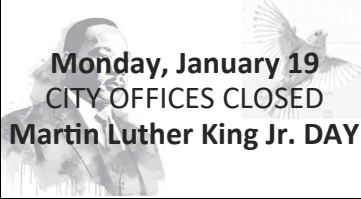

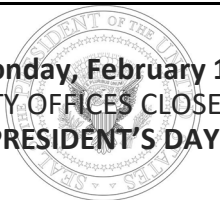

By establishing a clear roadmap for project selection and funding, the City of Deadwood aims to ensure transparency, fiscal responsibility, and community engagement in upcoming improvements.

Mayor and city officials expressed their appreciation for public input and collaboration that shaped the plan, emphasizing the city's dedication to building a vibrant and resilient future. Implementation of the 2026 - 2030 Capitol Improvement Plan will begin January 2026, with regular updates provided to the community.

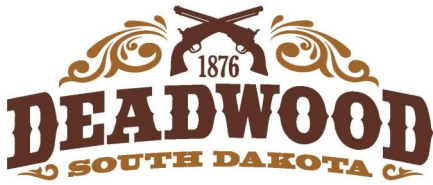
In 2026, while the nation honors America's 250th birthday, the City of Deadwood will simultaneously be celebrating its 150th birthday.

Snow Removal Policy

With winter snow here, the Public Works Department reminds you cars need to be off the street a day in advance of the scheduled cleaning. Streets will be posted prior to the snow removal day. If cars are not removed prior to snow removal it will be ticketed and towed.

Sidewalks need to also be cleared within 24 hours after the snow stops falling. Homeowners need to remind tenants to shovel as well. Failure to clear your sidewalk will result in it being cleared by the City at a rate of \$150 per person per hour or a contractor hired by the City. Those fees will be passed along to you with a \$50 administrative fee.

Snow should not be shoveled or blown into the street after its been cleaned. The City appreciates the cooperation of the citizens to assure our streets and sidewalks are safe and passable. If there are any questions, please contact us at (605) 578-3082.

It is also very important to do, because if your contact information is not in the database, then you will not receive alerts if any emergency were in your area.

Follow the simple steps to register for CodeRed:

- If you have internet log on to the City of Deadwood website or scan the QR code below
- Select the CodeRED Signup on the upper right of the homepage
- Click on CodeRED Community Notification
- Fill in the required information
- Select "Verify Information"
- Enter emergency notification phone numbers into your phone
- You are now registered for the CodeRED Notification System

2026 Free Dump Weekends

Tri-City Rubble offers free dump weekends throughout the year. Mark your calendars and stay aware for when you are able to take things to the dump:

- March 20 - 22
- September 18 - 20
- November 13 - 15

A load may consist of furniture, construction debris, glass, concrete, asphalt shingles, metal, brush, and compost. Loads **MUST** be separated into METAL, BURNABLES (unpainted woods, brush and stumps), CONCRETE and most other items fit into BURY.

Unauthorized wastes are cardboard, household trash, animals, food, clothing and blankets, and plastic toys. If there is doubt, call (605) 920-8957 between 8:00 am - 4:00 pm, Monday - Saturday for clarification.

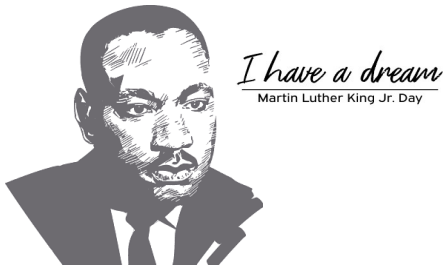

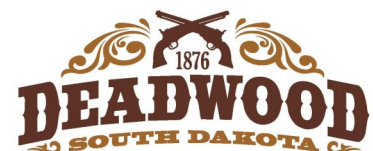
