It was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Williams to approve the minutes of Wednesday, March 11, 2015 as presented. Aye — All. Motion carried.

#### **Voucher Approval:**

#### Operating Account

It was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Berg to approve the HP Operating Account in the amount of \$52,586.08. Aye — All. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Namminga to approve the HP Bonded Account in the amount of \$25,081,20. Ave — All. Motion carried.

#### **Old or General Business:**

What you need to know when dealing with Historic Properties" Real Estate Workshop - No Action needed

Mr. Kuchenbecker informed the Commission the "What You Need to know When Dealing with Historic Properties" workshop is set for April 23, 2015 from 8:00am to 3:30pm at the Days of '76 Museum in Deadwood. He noted the workshop was approved by the South Dakota Real Estate Commission for 2 Required hours and 3 Elective hours of Continuing Education Units (a total of 5 CEUs). Workshop invitations along with the registration forms were sent out on Tuesday, March 24 to the Black Hills Association of Realtors and Mount Rushmore Association of Realtors in Spearfish and Rapid City; the first completed registration was received this morning.

Mr. Kuchenbecker stated the speakers for the workshop will consist of himself, Robert Nelson Jr., City Planning & Zoning Administrator; Ted Spencer, State Historic Preservation Office; Trent Mohr, City Building Inspector; and Mike Walker, Executive Lending Officer of NeighborWorks-Dakota Home Services. He reminded the Commissioners if any are interested in attending, they would be welcome and registration comped. He instructed those interested in attending to contact Ms. Fitch or Ms. Storhaug.

Chair Floyd agreed the workshop would be a great opportunity for Realtors as well as Commissioners to better understand how the Historic Preservation programs are presented and benefit not only new, but current property owners.

#### Final Approved Ordinance #1211: DCO 17.68 Historic Preservation

Mr. Kuchenbecker informed the Commission the Ordinance Amending Chapter 17.68: Historic Preservation was approved by City Commission with a vote of 3-2 for a second reading of the ordinance; he noted of the 11 proposed modifications, 4 were rejected with votes of 3-2 and 7 were accepted with votes of 5-0.

Mr. Kuchenbecker explained with the City Commission approving second reading of Ordinance#1211, the ordinance will be published; No publish date was known, however once published the ordinance becomes effective after 20 days.

Mr. Kuchenbecker thanked everyone on the Historic Preservation Commission, the City Commission, and staff who had a hand in implementing the changes.

Chair Floyd seconded Mr. Kuchenbecker's statement of gratitude. She noted it was a long process, however stressed the huge benefit it will be to the City and residents. She advised the Commission to continue educating themselves as to what ordinances say, to know their responsibilities within them and assure ordinances mean what they say. She thanked both Mr. Kuchenbecker and the Commission for their diligence.

Case #H15007 - 68 Sherman Street - Mechanical Upgrade/Screen Wall - TSP/Deadwood Post Office

Mr. Kuchenbecker informed the Commission the applicant requests permission to perform a mechanical upgrade to be surrounded by a 9 foot screen wall. He noted his meeting with the architect to discuss concerns regarding the 9 foot wall around HVAC unit. He suggested they look into an addition where the existing shed is located in their parking lot to address storage needs along with screening of the HVAC unit. Mr. Kuchenbecker stated the architect asked for time to check with their mechanical engineer and the appropriate federal agencies to confirm if doing so was a possibility.





#### OVERVIEW OF PROGRAM:

Since 2006 the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission has allocated funds for the installation of cemetery markers on unmarked graves within the historic city owned cemeteries of Deadwood. The purpose of this program is to assemble genealogical information on individual(s) and family(s) interred at Mt. Moriah Cemetery and St. Ambrose Catholic Cemetery. Applicants are required to furnish information which can be scanned in and placed on the City's IMS (Internet Mapping Server) program located at <a href="www.deadwoodims.com">www.deadwoodims.com</a> or the City of Deadwood's webpage <a href="www.cityofdeadwood.com">www.cityofdeadwood.com</a>

#### STIPULATIONS OF THE HEADSTONE GRANT PROGRAM

The program is designed for one name per cemetery monument. For any additional names, separate applications will need to be filled out and submitted separately to the Historic Preservation Office. Due to cost and significant amount of unmarked graves in the historic Deadwood cemeteries, burials which pre-date the year 1950 are eligible for the program. Nominations which post-date the year 1950 may be eligible under the review and recommendations of the Cemetery Committee.

#### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Individuals who would like to participate in the Cemetery Headstone Grant Program are required to fill out the Cemetery Headstone application and submit supporting documentation on the nominee in the form of:

- 1. Birth certificate and/or birth announcement, or relevant document
- 2. Death certificate and/or obituary or relevant document
- 3. Copies of census records pertaining to the nominee for the years 1870 to 1930
- 4. Copies of family history pertaining to the deceased
- 5. Family tree
- 6. Copies of photographs showing the nominee and/or family
- 7. Other relevant documents which will aide in the interpretation of the nominee

All submitted applications will be reviewed by the Cemetery Committee, a subcommittee of the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission. Depending on the completeness of the application, placement of the monument will take two to six months from submission of the application. Successful applicants will receive a formal letter from the Deadwood Historic Preservation Office indicating the admission into the program.

#### STONE REQUIREMENTS:


Successful applications will be awarded one 16 inch tall by 16 inch wide wedge shaped headstone (See figure #1 for size). The inscription on the face of the monument will be limited to the following information:

- · Deceased name (first name, middle initial, last name)
- Birth year (four digit)
- Death year (four digit)

The vital information of the nominee will be a sunken letter laid out in Roman Type font (see figure #2 for font size and layout). Any additions or modifications to the aforementioned layout will be at the applicant's expense and may delay the progress of the grant.

John Katen (1861 – 1935) Life in the Black Hills of South Dakota (1890 – 1935)

- 1890 Katen arrives February 20 at the Homestake Hotel in Lead
- 1892 In Spearfish on Avenue H, Katen opens a large saloon and gambling room with the Tierney brothers
- 1893 Katen and Tierney construct a two story addition to their saloon in Spearfish
- 1894 Katen goes to Belle Fourche to look at business opportunities
- 1895 Katen and Tierney brothers sell their saloon and gambling house on Avenue H in Spearfish
- 1895 The Bodega Saloon in Deadwood is sold by Walter Simpson to Katen and Tierney
- 1895 The Bodega Saloon reopens Wednesday January 23, 1895 under new owners Katen and Tierney
- 1900 Katen and John Manning, Deadwood pioneer and fist sheriff of Lawrence County, leave for the gold fields of Alaska

John Katen, 72, a well-known resident of Deadwood for the last 45 years, died at noon Sunday from a cerebral hemorrhage suffered at the entrance to the Elks clubrooms in this city. He had ascended the stairs leading to the second floor of the building and collapsed when he reached the landing. He was dead when persons in the building reached his side.

Deceased came to Deadwood in 1890 and aside from periods spent in Nevada and Alaska some years ago, had made his home here continuously from that time.

#### CRITERIA FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATNESS

The Historic District Commission shall use the following criteria in granting or denying the Certificate of Appropriateness:

#### **General Factors:**

- 1. Historic significance of the resource: The construction of the Post Office, a federal building standing 3 stories high, occurred during a period of major development of Sherman Street. Between 1890 and 1910, six major buildings were completed: Lawrence County Courthouse, Adams buildings, Smith building, Odd Fellows building and expansion of several other businesses. These developments made Sherman Street the focus of wholesale activity as well as government at the dawn of the century. This building is of the architectural style Neo-Classical Revival. Of the three public buildings: Library, County Courthouse and Post Office the Post Office is the most elaborate in design and best condition.
- **2.** Architectural design of the resource and proposed alterations: The applicant requests permission to perform a mechanical upgrade and surround by a 9 ft screen wall with a soft joint provided between the masonry screen wall and building to avoid marring of the stone or markings as submitted.

**Staff Opinion:** Staff has worked with the Architect to remedy concerns with the original proposed concept. New plans were submitted proposing the existing shed be moved out and the mechanical upgrade shielding the HVAC unit be put into its place along the sidewalk and railing.






### Revolving Loan Fund – Special Needs/WOOD WINDOWS Policy Guidelines

#### 1. Statement of Purpose:

The restoration and protection of Deadwood's historic buildings and structures are acknowledged to be a primary part of the City's goal to preserve and maintain Deadwood's historic integrity. The expense of such restoration and protection projects may discourage property owners from having the work completed or may result in lower quality of craftsmanship. The purpose of this loan fund is to assist and encourage property owners to repair first, were possible, and replace, only if necessary, their properties through the use of quality materials and craftsmanship.

#### 2. Objective:

The City of Deadwood is a National Historic Landmark and is listed on the National and South Dakota State Registers of Historic Places. Maintaining these designations is critical to the economic success of the City and quality of life of its residents. The objective of the loan program is to stimulate the quality restoration and protection of buildings and structures that contribute to the historic integrity of the City of Deadwood.

#### 3. Eligibility:

To be eligible for Revolving Loan Funds – Special Needs/Wood Windows, a project must meet the following criteria:

- a. The project must affect a property listed on the city's 1994 Historic Sites Inventory as an historic property in the Deadwood National Historic Landmark District. Properties not listed on the inventory must be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places as defined in the National Park Service's National Register Bulletin 15: How to Apply the National Register Criteria for Evaluation.
- b. The building must a residential property;

The City of Deadwood's Historic Preservation Officer and Building Inspector determine a project's eligibility. All eligible applications are subject to the review of the Deadwood Historic Preservation Commission.

#### **Wood Windows:**

#### 4. Program Requirements:

- 1. The program provides a forgivable loan of \$150 per window for the restoration of an existing wood window or for the removal of an inappropriate window alteration and installation of a window that is appropriate in material and style of operation for a particular house.
- 2. The program provides a forgivable loan of \$100 per window opening for the purchase and installation of new primary wood windows.
- 3. The program provides a forgivable loan of \$150 per window opening for the restoration of existing wooden storms and screens or for the purchase and installation of approved wooden storms and screens, if restoration is not an option or is not possible.
- 4. Only recording cost are collected.

#### Revolving Loan Fund – Special Needs/WOOD WINDOWS Policy Guidelines
