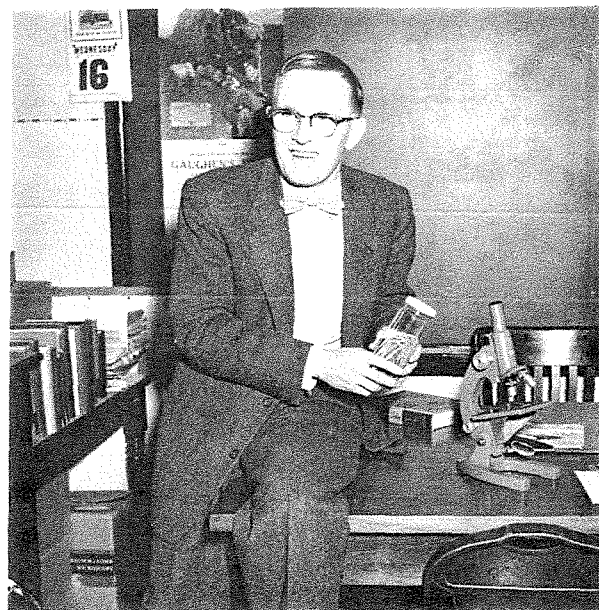
Mr. Glenn Burgess

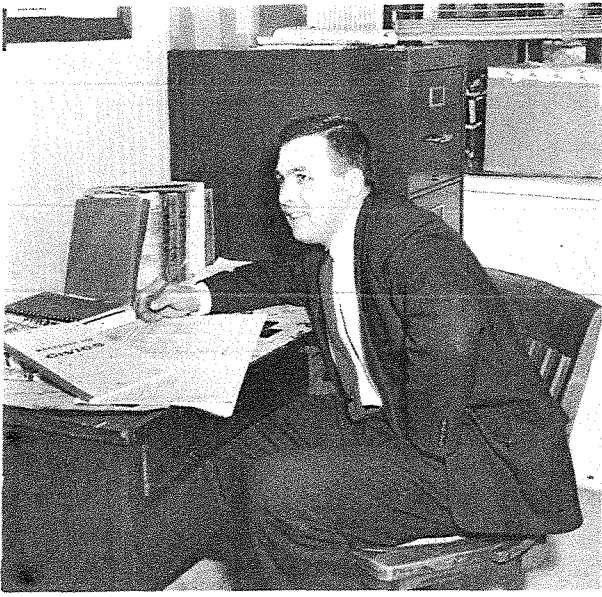
Mrs. Hilda McCleave

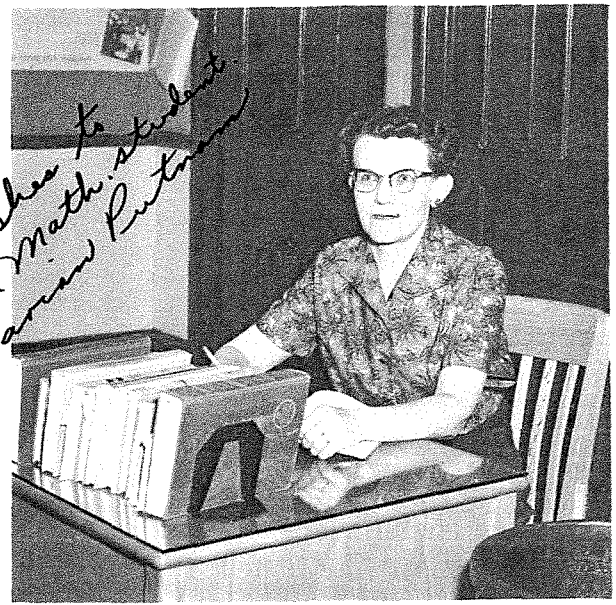
Mr. J. Ora Horsfall

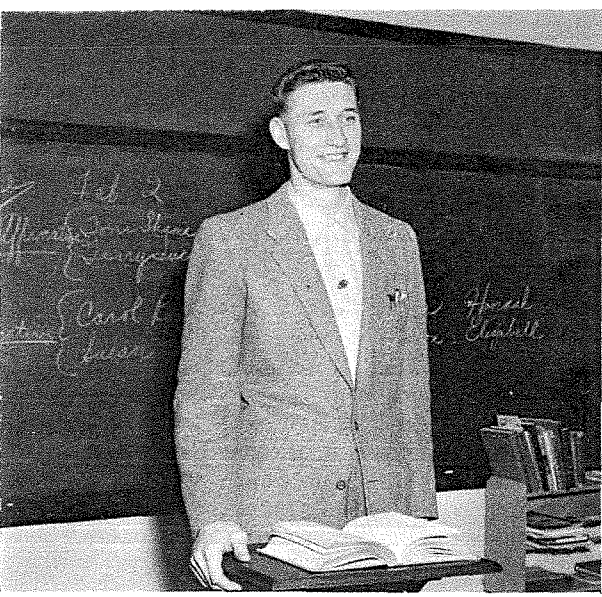


Mr. Ralph J. Polenz  
 Assistant Coach Polenz taught civics, general business, and world history in room 310. His B. S. degree in education came from U. S. D. This was his first year at D. H. S.

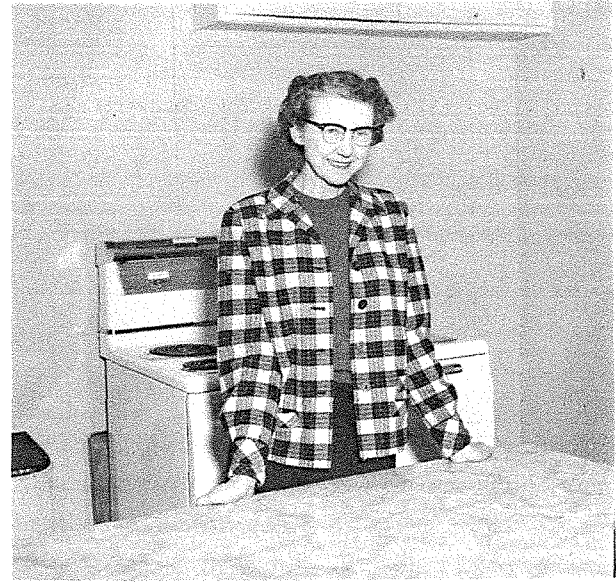

At All-State Band, two of the chairs were held down by Juniors. They were Diane Clements, and Herb Clark.

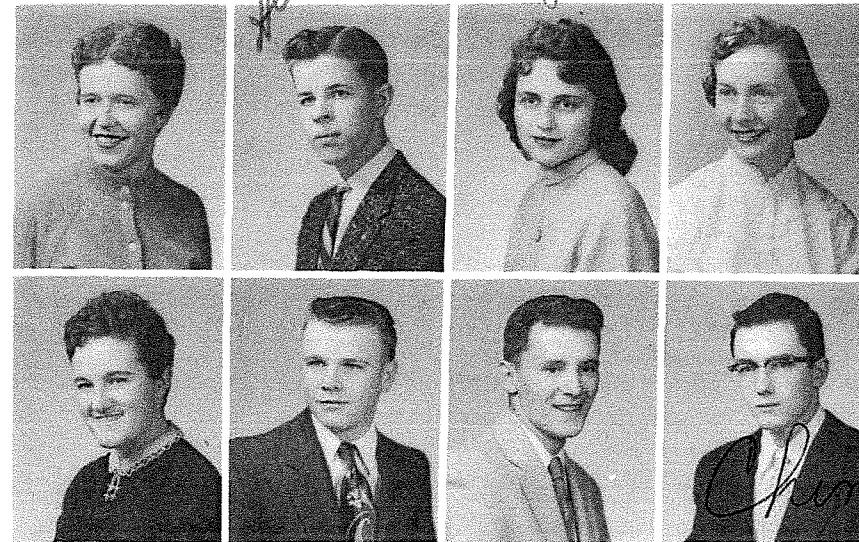
Herb Clark and Jack Sears represented Deadwood on the campus of Northern State Teachers College at Boy's State.

## SENIORS RECALL A BIG YEAR

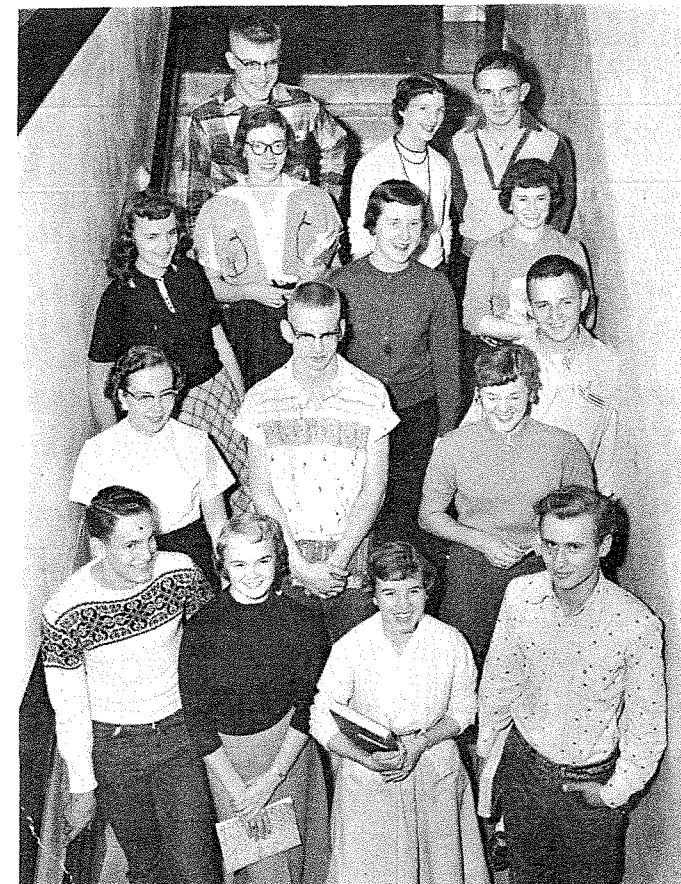
