USD.






Mrs. Marian Putnam

Herb Clark and Jack Sears represented Deadwood on the campus of Northern State Teachers College at Boy's State.



#### SENIORS RECALL A BIG YEAR





























### "LET ME GROW UP" IS TRIUMPH FOR JUNIORS


The Junior class worked hard and long to bring "Let Me Grow Up," a humorous play by Anne Coulter Martens, to the high school auditorium November 9.


