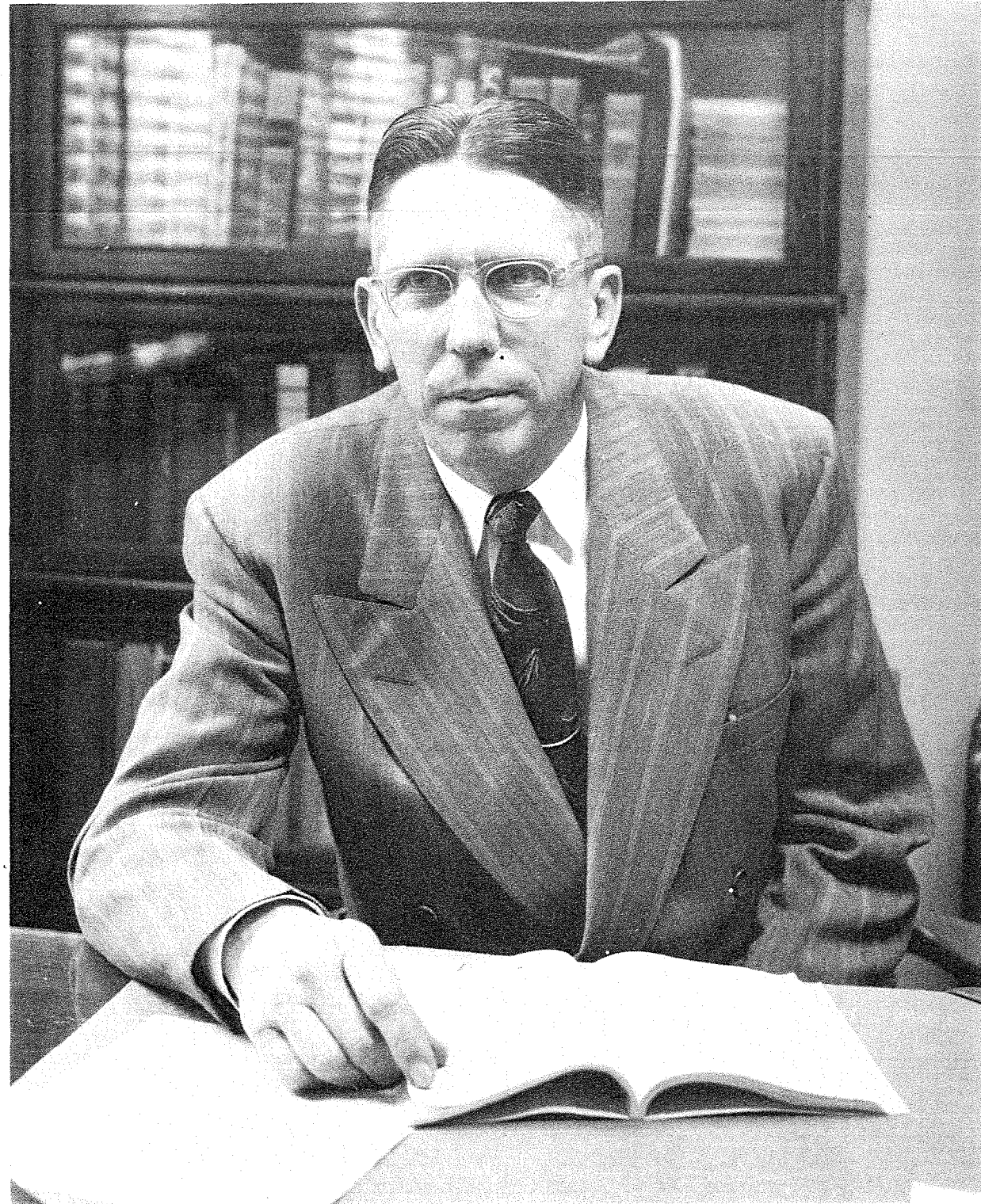
"Indeed the Wise Man's office
