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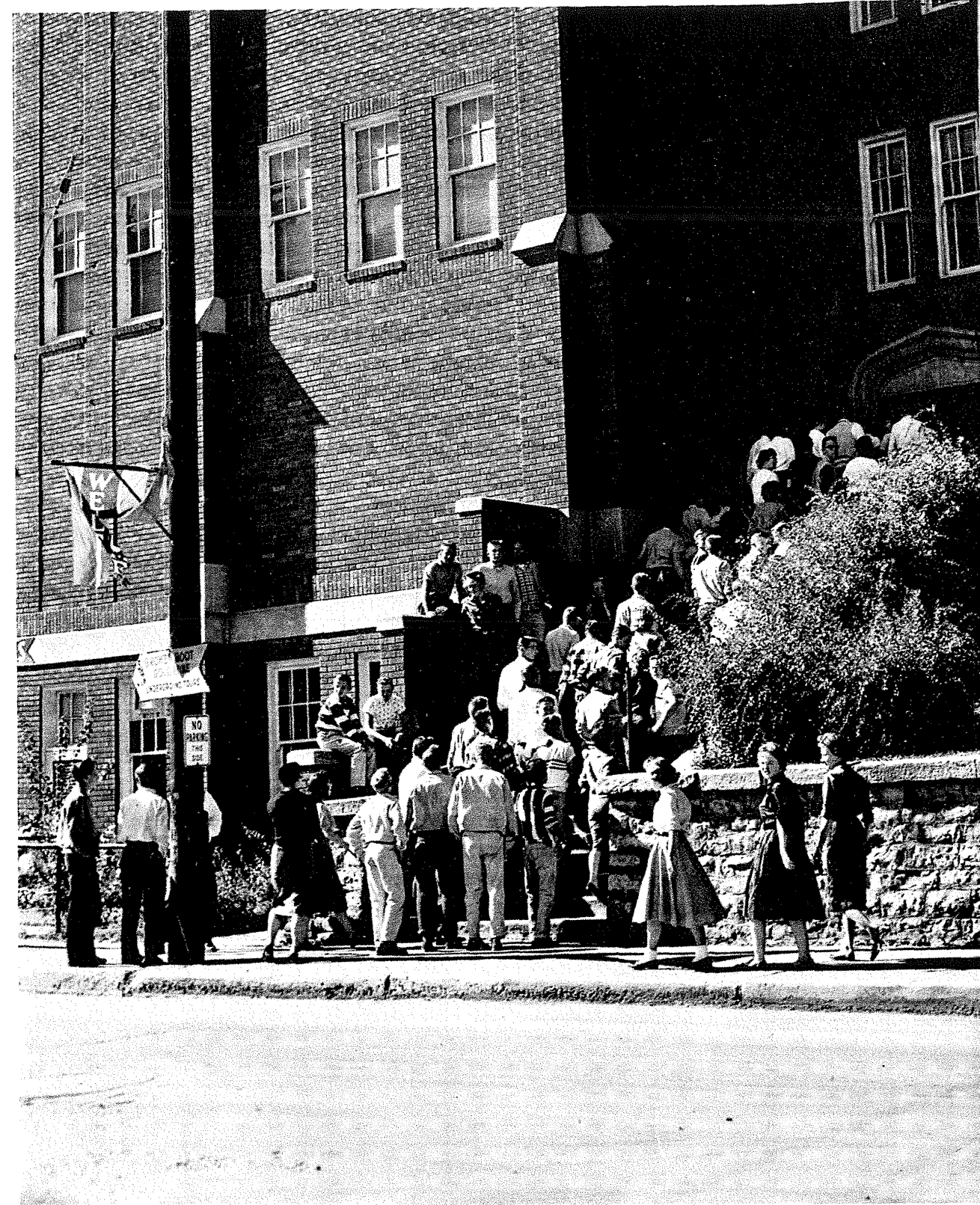


## We Dedicate . . .



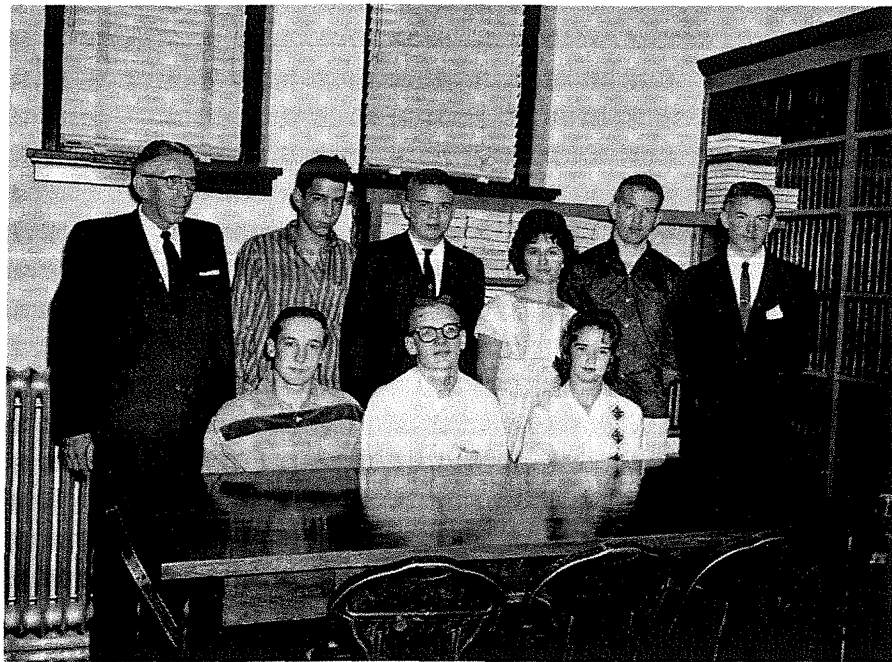
MR. H. S. BERGER

The class theme for their Bear Day float was "Stop Spearfish Cold!" Bonnie Dahlberg, the class queen, sat in an igloo made of napkins.

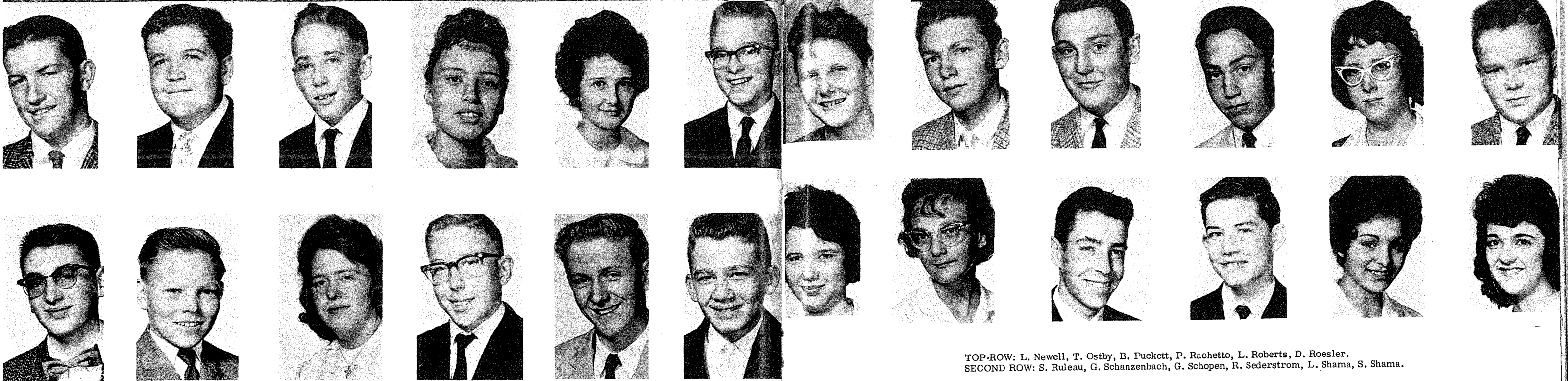

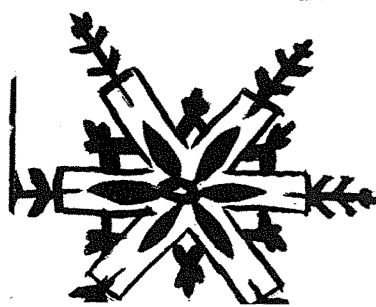

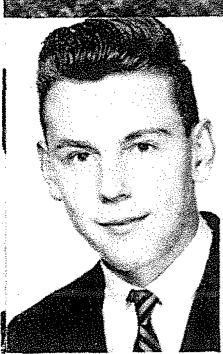
By selling pens, candy, and other items the class started to raise money for future activities. These sales were successful and proved very prosperous to the class financially.

## Basketball

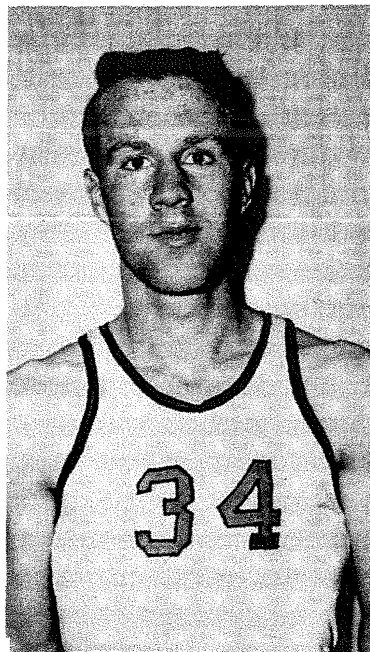

The turning point of the season came as Deadwood thumped Rapid City Cathedral in a non-conference game. The result was a winning streak of 5 games.

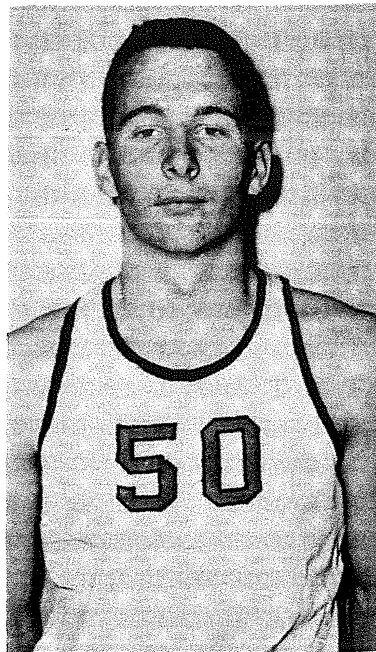
Hearts beat high as tournament time rolled around, but a highly respected Vale quint crushed all hopes of a chance at a state title.



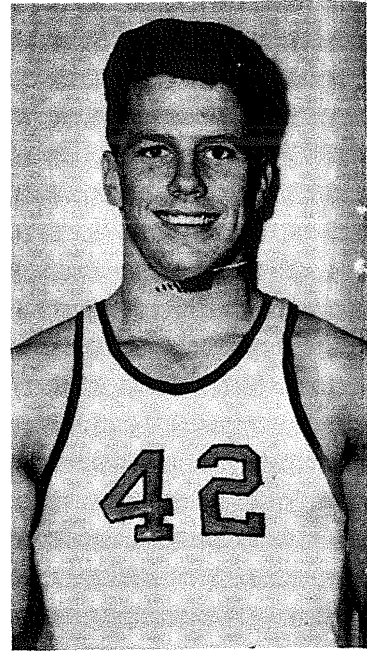

## Bear Log Staff Races Deadline

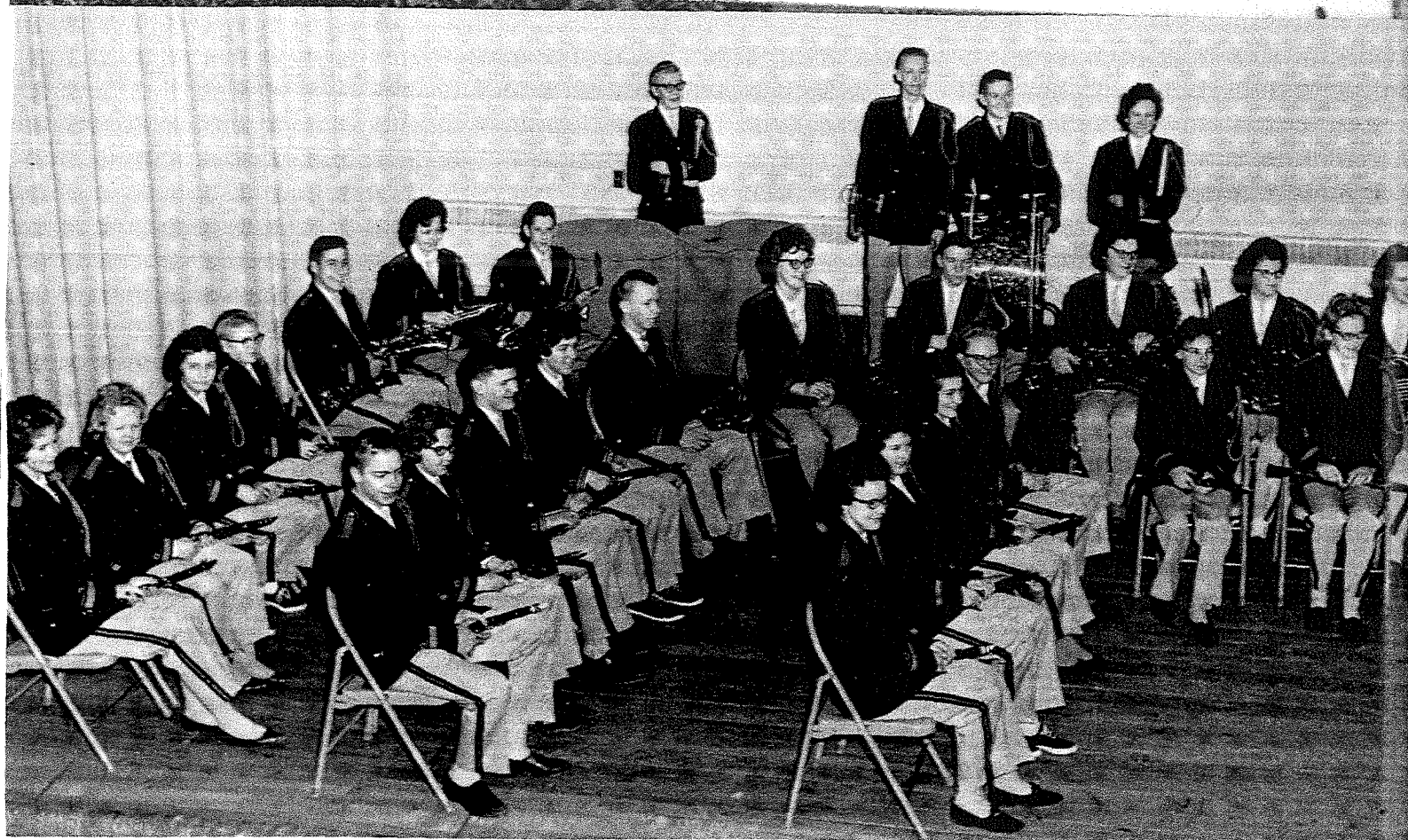
