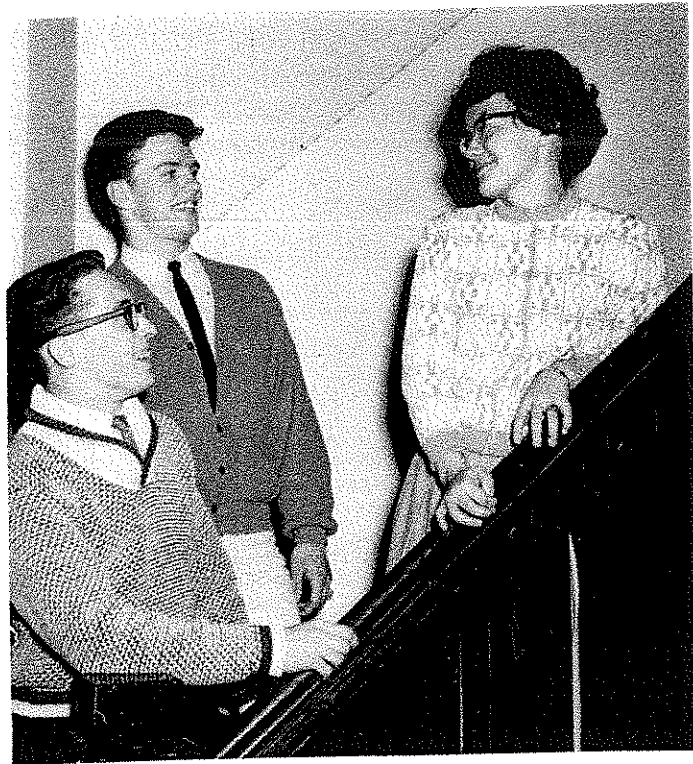
Lead High School was the stage for the annual Student Congress of the Black Hills area.

After their day discussing international, national and state issues in parliamentary manner they felt better able to understand the workings of our state and federal legislatures.

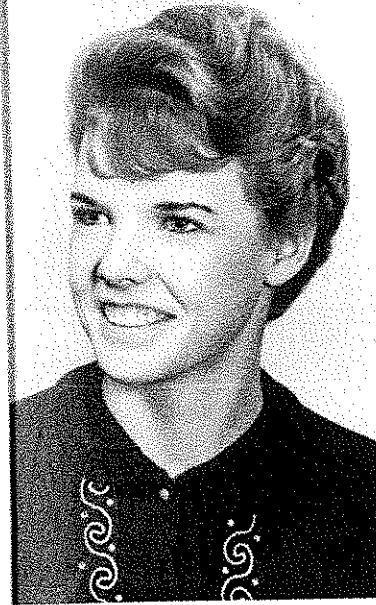

"Gobble Up Custer" was the theme of the Sophomore Class. Queen Donna Clowser was accompanied by D. Mattox.



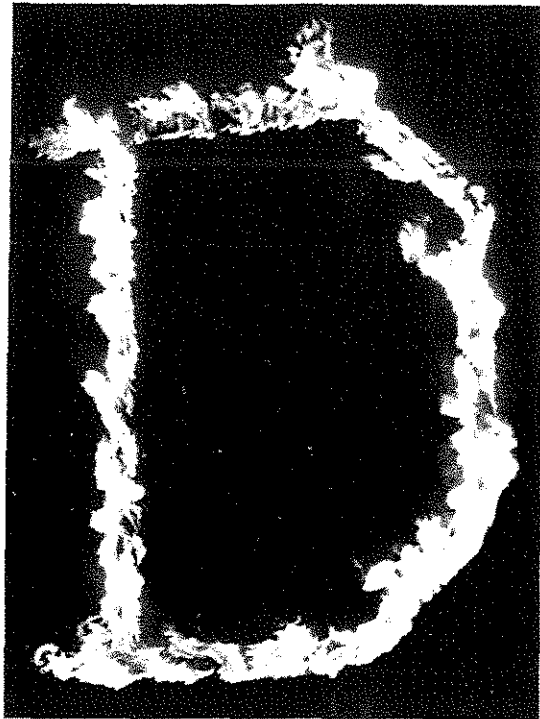

Arthur Campbell and Sandra Larive were student piano accompanists this year.

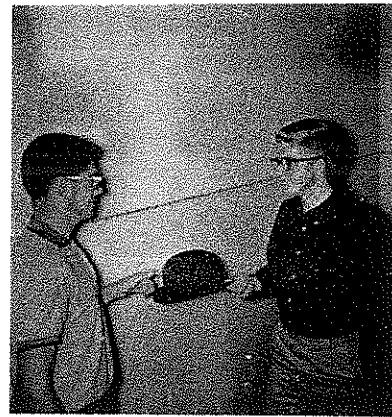

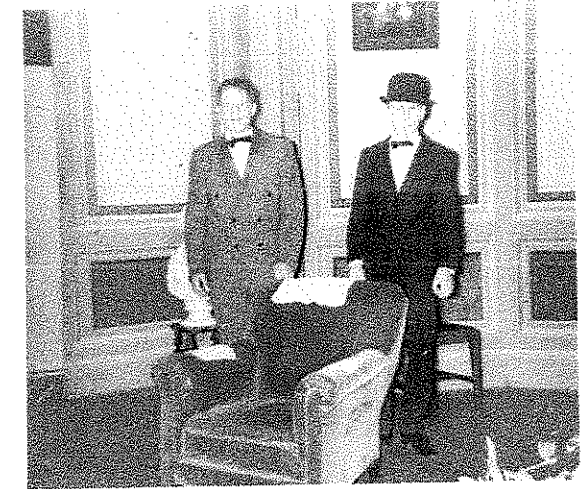

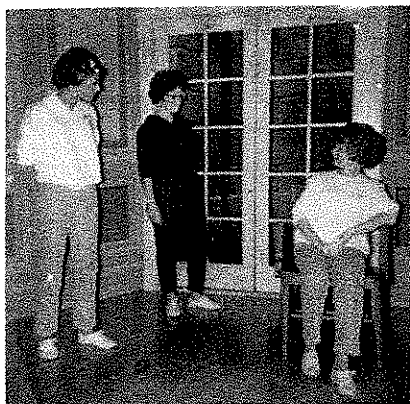

Because of Mr. Smith's "inability to manage his own family" he first loses his job then is rehired in St. Louis.



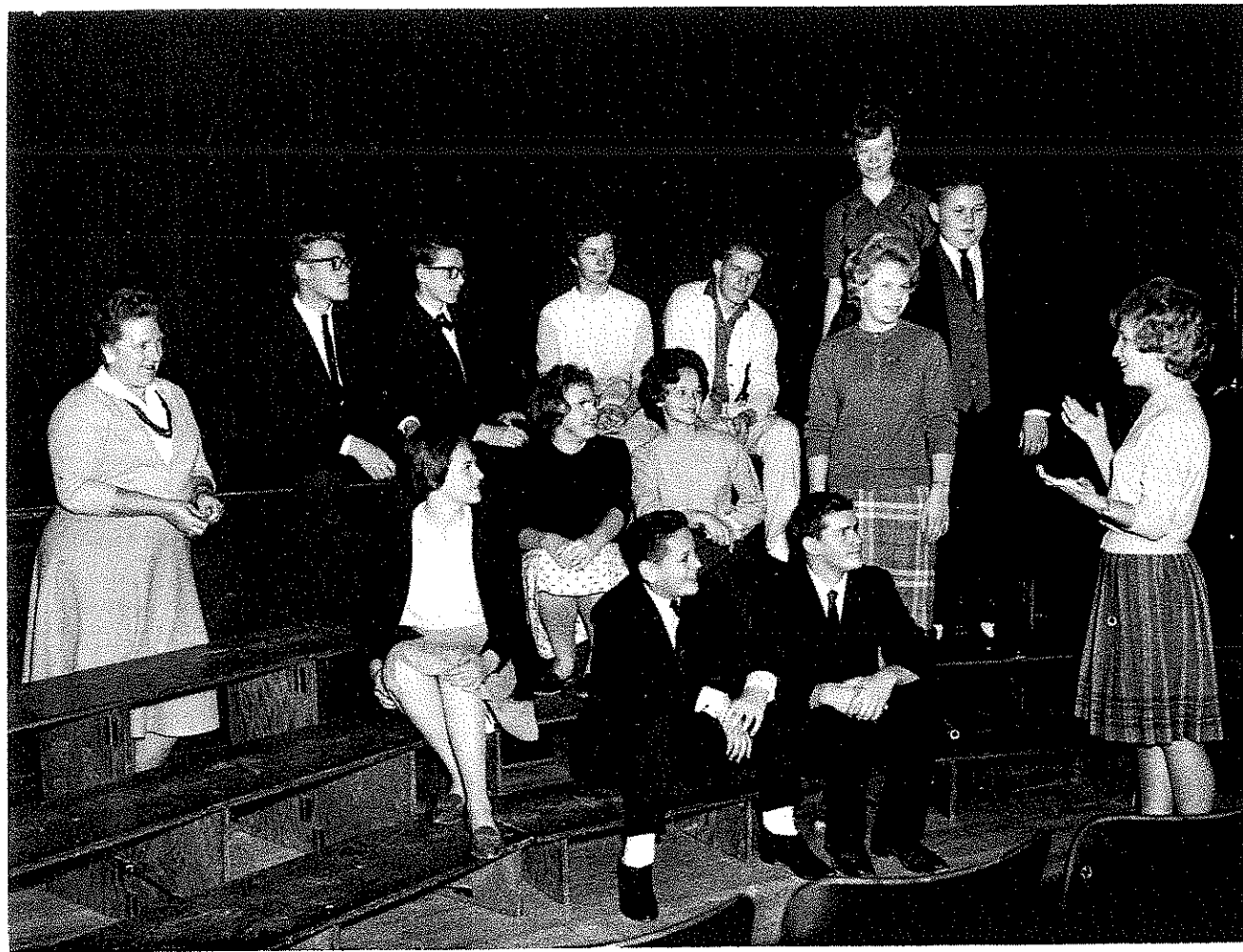

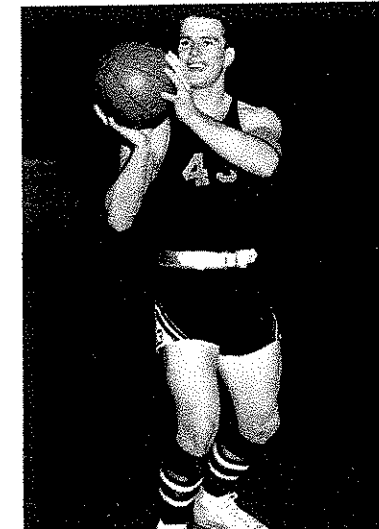

A highlight of this year's season was the presence of two Bears among the top scorers of the Black Hills Conference of 1963.

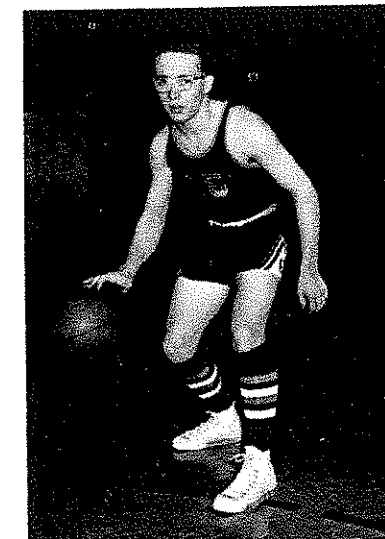
