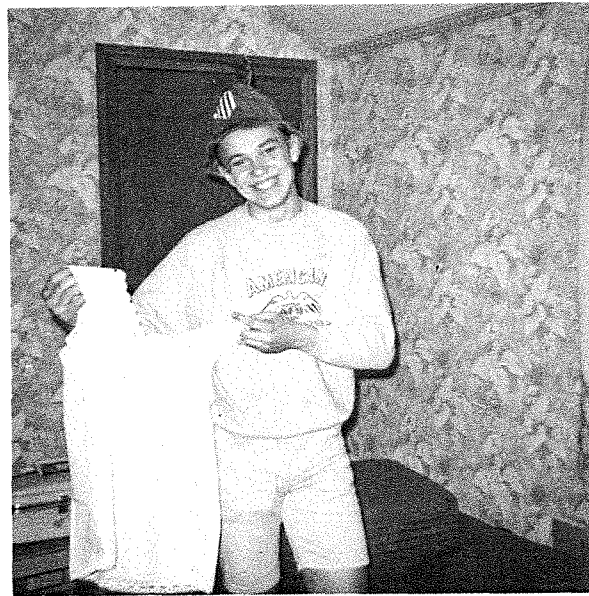

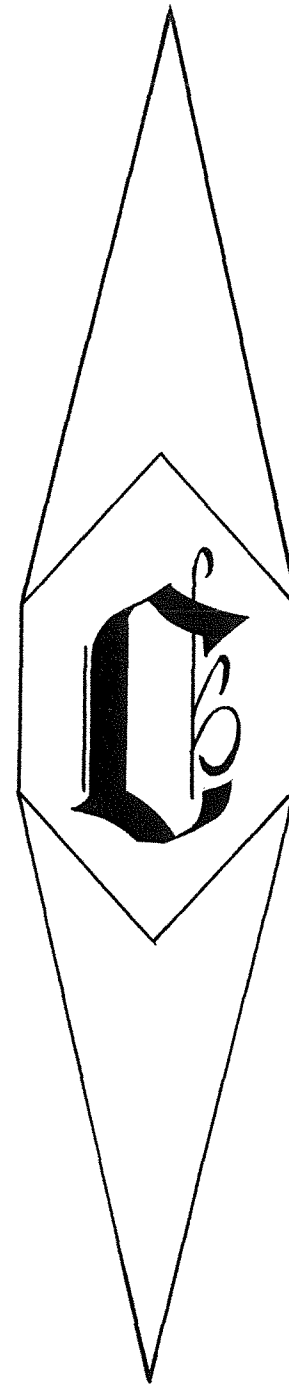

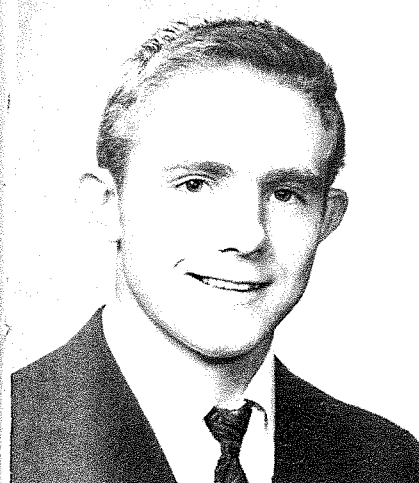

Marc Daniels headed the class as president, with Tom Zupet, Jane Nelson, and Faunille Pearson acting as his assistants.



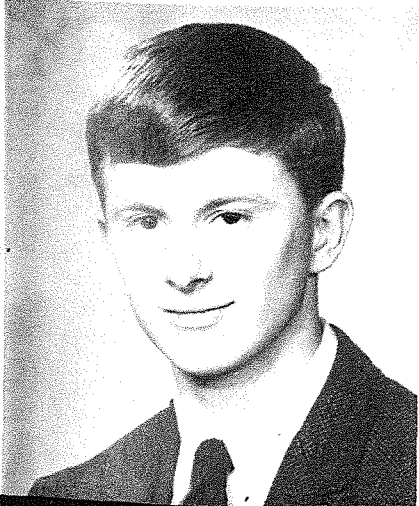

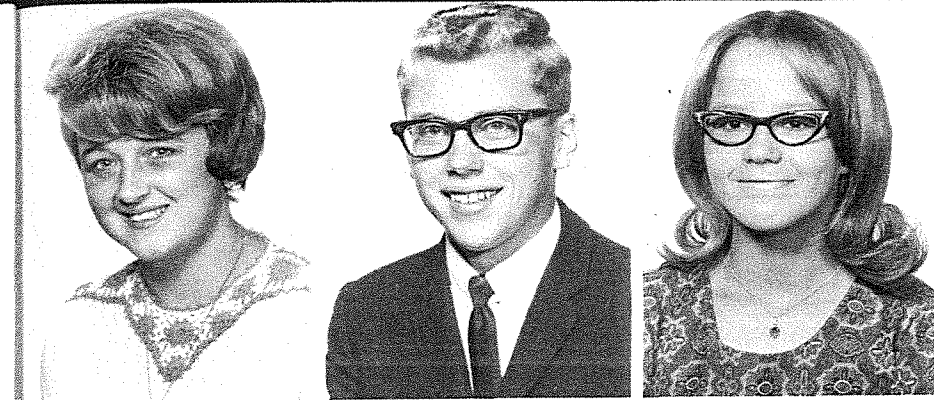
The Sophomore Class this year elected Richard McVay as president; David Sulentic, vice-president; and Richard Harlan as Secretary-treasurer.

Mr. D. Myers and Mr. J. Williams acted as class advisors.

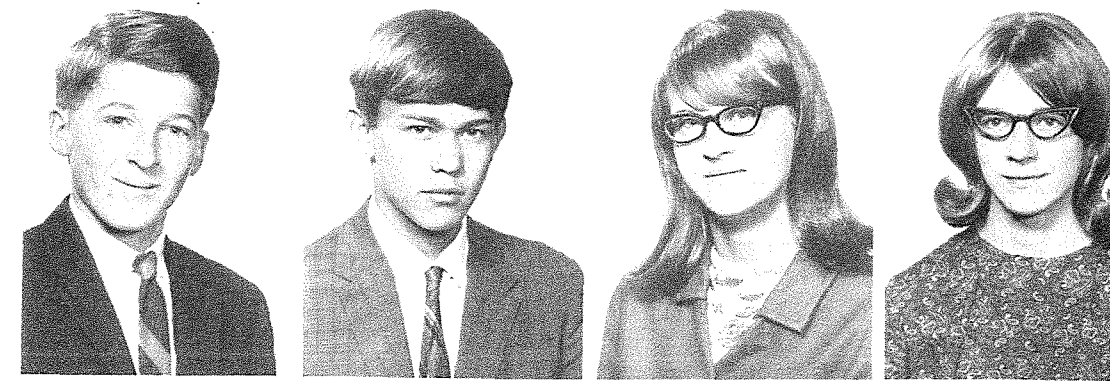

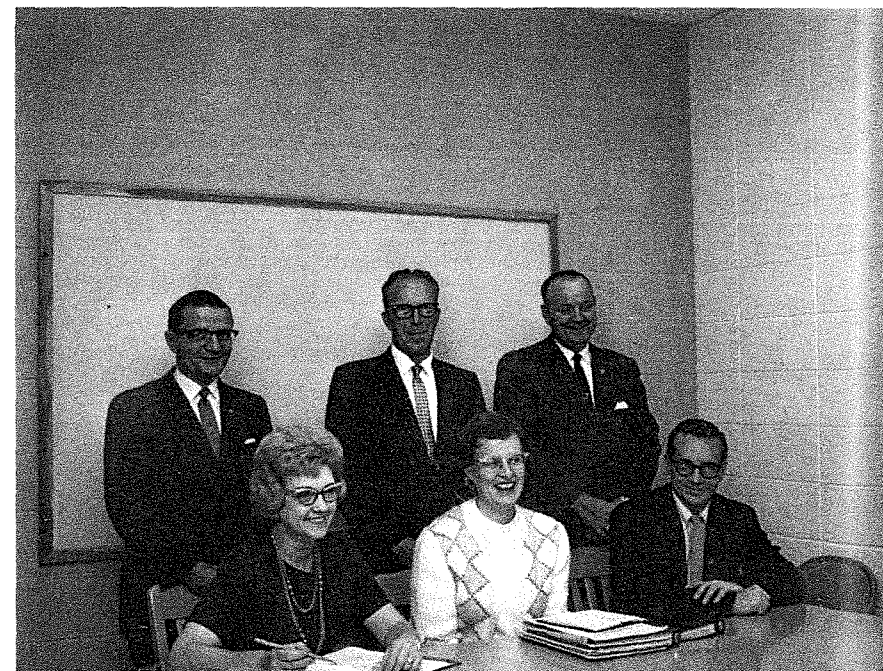
Administration Aids in Quest for Knowledge

Much credit has to be given for the outstanding coaching by Coach Divich and Coach Huffman.



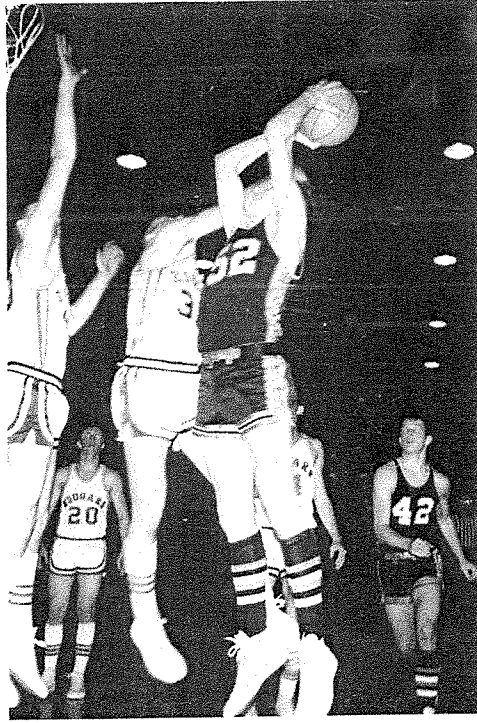

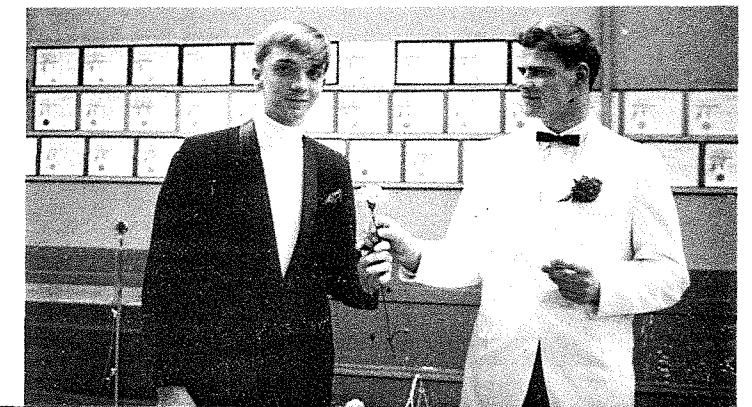
Following the Banquet the students returned to the high school gym where they danced to the music of Johnny Simpson's band.
